## MANOR LAKES P12 COLLEGE SECONDARY STUDENT GENERAL APPEARANCE POLICY

Ratified by School Council on 26/07/2018 (to be reviewed – July 2021)

## **RATIONALE**

A 'student general appearance' set of guidelines as determined by the College, promotes a sense of inclusiveness and cohesion, citizenship and school spirit. A College Uniform is mandated, as is general appearance guidelines.

## **AIMS**

- To provide clear guidelines regarding students' general appearance, e.g. the wearing of makeup/cosmetics to school, hairstyles and colours, etc.
- To promote equality amongst all students
- To provide an environment that is safe, healthy and enhances the positive image of the school in the wider community.

## **IMPLEMENTATION**

- This policy forms part of and is to be read in conjunction with the College's Uniform Policy
- This policy is compulsory and is to be adhered to by all College students
- After consultation with the college community, College Council has developed this set of guidelines that applies during school hours and when students are on excursions /camps
- As a result the following guidelines apply whilst at the College or involved in College related activities: -
- Obvious make-up such as coloured lipsticks or coloured lip glosses, eye make-up, such as coloured eye shadow, eyeliner, mascara, or skin glitters and blush, are not approved whilst students attend the College, or College excursions/camps. A signed medical certificate is mandatory if make—up is required for medical reasons.
- False/Acrylic nails are a safety concern and are therefore not permitted
- In classes where there is an OHS risk e.g. technology hair length beyond the collar is to be fastened back (with accessories in college colours) and off the face at all times.
- Under Australian Law, it is deemed illegal for a minor under the age of 18 years to receive a tattoo. Legal ramifications exist for parents /guardians and tattooist should this action take place.
- Sunscreen products are generally encouraged but coloured (zinc) creams are not allowed
- Jewellery: stud earrings or sleepers worn in the ears dangling earrings and jewellery such as rings, bangles and necklaces are an OHS risk and should not be worn

- Significant items of jewellery (e.g religious icons, cultural symbols etc...) can only be worn with Principal Class Team permission after a letter explaining the reason/s is submitted from the Parents/Guardian. These items must be unobtrusive, non-offensive and of no safety concern.
- Students who have visible parts of their faces pierced to accommodate jewellery are required to do one of the following whilst attending the College or representing the College community:
  - Remove the jewellery during school hours, or
  - Replace all jewellery with sleepers or studs, which are unobtrusive and do not pose a safety hazard.
  - For health reasons "new" facial piercing must be covered with bandages (except ears).
- Students wearing unacceptable items of jewellery will be asked to remove them. The items will be kept with the Principal /Principal Class Team or at the main administration office.
- Under Australian Law, it is deemed illegal for a minor under the age of 18 years to have body /facial piercing without parent/guardian consent.
