### Building a Love of Reading

One important way parents can continue to support your children's development over the holiday period is to continue reading aloud with your children especially from Years 3 to 6. Research has shown more than half of parents stop reading with their children once they start to be able to read for themselves.

The Department of Education has launched the Never Stop Reading! Initiative with videos and factsheets for parents.

A researched based strategy for increasing student achievement is reinforcing effort and providing recognition. By enhancing students' understandings of the relationship between effort and achievement, we can also address students' attitudes and beliefs about themselves as learners. Students at Manor Lakes set personal learning goals to work towards, by tracking their efforts in relation to their achievements students are able to reflect on what it takes to achieve that objective and on the progress toward doing so. Asking students to discuss what they are learning about and the relationship between their own efforts and achievement provides opportunities to reinforce the control that students have over their own learning. Reaching that goal is sometimes very hard and frustrating, a little like climbing a hill but worth it in the end.

On Friday the 7th of September students participated in the annual footy colours day. Students enjoyed finding out who barracked for who and discussing footy whether it be soccer, AFL or rugby. Prep - 2 students enjoyed footy activities for the first 2 sessions with students from year 3-6 out playing sessions 3 & 4.
