Dear Parents and Carers,

On Tuesday our 2017 Preps started their transition afternoon at the college. We had around 70 future students come along to experience some time in the classroom. These students will attend weekly for the next four weeks until the 5th December. We also had our Prep Parent Information session on Tuesday night with around 60 future and current parents coming along to hear all about the college and programs.

Yesterday was the start of year 12 exams across the state. It is a nervous time for all concerned, students and parents, and I wish our students all the very best over the next few weeks.

Next Monday we have a curriculum day at the college followed on by a public holiday for Melbourne Cup day on the Tuesday so no students are required at the college on either of these days.

Our grade 2 students have their annual school sleepover happening in Amadeus Hall next Wednesday night. There are many excited students that are looking forward to the fun activities planned for the night and getting a chance to have a sleepover with their class mates. There will be some very sleepy students and staff on Thursday I am sure!

Yesterday our grade 6 softball team headed off to Keilor Park to participate in the SSV Primary State Softball Finals. They lost their first match again Newport Gardens 9 to 3 there was lots of nerves for the first game but then in the second match against Manifold Primary School it was a close game, 6 to 5, with some amazing catches from Marcello, Diesel and Gardynia and two home runs by Suliasi! The third and final match was a loss against Manama Primary School but there was some excellent fielding from the boys and another 2 home runs from Suliasi and an individual home run from River. Thanks to Wendy Ballard who has been with the team along the way and she reported back to me that the boys always showed our four school values and played respectfully and lost gracefully. Well done to all of the boys!



I attended my first College School Council meeting last night in my official capacity as principal. I was able to explain some of my intentions around student learning and College organisation beyond 2016. I have a very explicit expectation on teachers focussing on working with students to achieve the best outcomes possible. To this end, the College will organise as a primary, P-6, sub-school and a secondary, 7-12 sub-school in 2017 and beyond. There will be minimal impact on parents and students from this decision, it is based on curriculum organisation, teacher work agreements, and teaching approaches in different year levels.

I also spoke about the school's facilities including my surprise and concern about the lack of security fencing around the school. I am interested in receiving feedback from parents about a proposal to erect higher fencing around the school. My reasons for proposing this are:

- Student safety: erecting fencing separating students from vehicle areas. Currently there is no fencing between the car parks on Minindee Rd and the play areas, nor is there any fencing separating students from the delivery area at the back of the school
- Strangers entering the grounds: I have observed adults walk through the school, and have read about incidents of this occurring in the past. This has resulted in staff locking themselves into buildings if they are in the school over holiday periods or outside hours. It also impacts on student safety in that there is nothing to limit the access of unknown persons entering the grounds.
- School security: the current open nature of the school enables people to enter the school grounds outside hours and this has resulted in theft, vandalism and general damage to facilities.

I would be pleased to hear from parents their thoughts on the proposals, both positive and negative. This feedback will be considered by school council when making the decision on whether to install security fencing. My email address is: warner.stephen.r@edumail.vic.gov.au


