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Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF)

Throughout the year, opportunities will be provided for students to participate in incursions and excursions to enhance the classroom program. Further information about these events, including associated costs, will be provided to parents/carers as these opportunities arise.

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the cost of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount per student will be: \$125 for primary students and \$225 for secondary students.

***You will be informed via Compass when CSEF application forms are available.**

Payment Options

As the beginning of the year can be a financially draining time for families, a part payment of these costs can be made in term 1, with the remaining payments being made throughout the year.

We have a number of payment options available to families which are listed below:

- Payment can be made online via Compass Pay.
- Payment via BPay. Your unique family BPay number appears on your family statement. For all new families please phone the College office for your unique BPay number.

Please note if you choose any of these options you will **not** need to attend the College on our payment day. Your child's book pack will be delivered to their classroom.
