Payment Options

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Camps, Sports & Excursions Fund (CSEF)

CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the cost of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF. The allowance will be paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions, or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount per student will be \$225 for secondary students.

***You will be informed via Compass when CSEF application forms are available.**

Year 9 Elite Sport

If your child is participating in this subject, there will be an additional cost of \$45.00 for this program. This will only be charged to those that are enrolled in these classes.

BYOD (Bring Your Own Device)

As part of our college's new eLearning Strategy 2015-2017, students in years 9-12 in 2017 are to supply a personally owned Apple device. This device, either iOS (iPad, iPad Mini) or OSX (MacBook, MacBook Pro, MacBook Air) will support and compliment all teaching and learning programs throughout the college. Personally owned devices will have full and complete access to the college network and infrastructure. Devices brought to the college will need to have the appropriate applications and software installed.

Blazer (Optional uniform addition in Year 9)

All students in year 9 have the option to purchase a college blazer to add as part of their summer or winter uniform. This blazer is currently a compulsory uniform item from Year 10 and costs between \$175 - \$189 depending on the size.

School Council will review the school uniform during 2017.

School Dates and Times for Year 9 Students

Students in year 9 will be starting school on Tuesday 31st January 2017.

School will start at 8.50am, and supervision of students starts fifteen minutes prior (8.35am). Students will be dismissed at 3.00pm, and supervision concludes 15 minutes after dismissal (3.15pm).
