



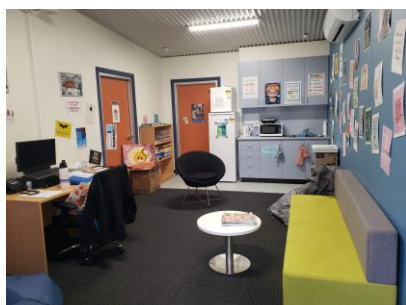

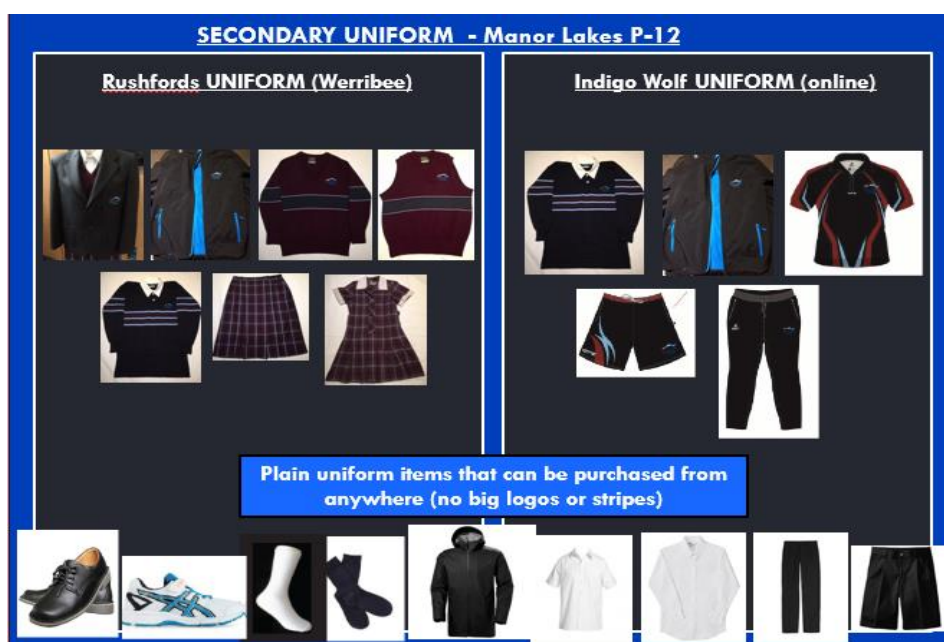

Change in Bus Service

As part of bus service upgrades in Melbourne's west, [Route 191 - Werribee Station to Jubilee Estate via Greaves Street](#) will be extended to Manor Lakes and Jubilee Estates.



This means instead of turning off Manor Lakes Boulevard at Minindee Road, it will continue on Manor Lakes Boulevard. Students from Manor Lakes College will be able to catch the service from Manor Lakes Boulevard. There will be bus stops on both sides of the road (the bus will not stop on Minindee Road) – see diagram attached.

Manor Lakes teenager John Mathet is all smiles after winning the People's Choice Award at the Wyndham Art Prize.

John, 18, said he entered the Wyndham council art competition for the first time this year with a digital painting he created on a tablet, which portrays a little girl standing alone.

John was presented with the competition's People's Choice Award, as voted by visitors to the exhibition, last month.

The award was sponsored by not-for-profit community organisation Arts Assist.

John said while creating his award-winning artwork, he reflected on his own experience growing up in Kenya and South Sudan, during which he experienced conflicts, war, poverty and an interrupted education.

"Overcoming all of that, and coming to a place like Wyndham, is a blessing," he said.

John said he was grateful for the support of his family, friends and Manor Lakes College, where he is completing year 11.

John said winning the People's Choice Award was "surreal", as he had entered the competition simply to learn from older artists and gain some exposure for his work.

"The moment they told me, it was unbelievable. I was just blown away," he said.

John described the process of creating art as feeling like "being on top of the world".

"I just feel free, put anything onto the canvas and tell stories with my art," he said.

Currently in Year 12 and considering Tertiary study?

Victorian courses: The Victorian Tertiary Admissions Centre (VTAC) processes course applications on behalf of participating higher education institutions. From Monday 5 August, you will be able to create a VTAC account and apply for vocational and higher education courses. VTAC has developed a series of resources to assist students with their applications. The following are three examples:

Focus on Open Days

If you are considering studying at TAFE or university after school, it is **crucial** that you attend Open Days.

Throughout the year, vocational and tertiary institutions open their doors to the public and showcase their courses, accommodation, scholarships, pathway courses, student services and their 'point of difference'.

At an Open Day, you will be able to:

Get a feel for the culture of the campus

Learn about courses and career options

Undertake campus and accommodation tours led by current students

Speak directly to student ambassadors and lecturers about the courses or careers you are interested in

Compare the course area you are interested in at different institutions

Learn about sports and societies you can join and be active in

Get course counselling and guidance

Attend information sessions and workshops

Watch live demonstrations

Listen to bands, eat lots of food, participate in activities and have fun!

Don't just pick a course at an institution without visiting the campus – you potentially will be spending several years studying there and spending tens of thousands of dollars on your course and accommodation. It's worth making the effort.

In the next column is a list of questions you may like to ask at Open Days.

Victorian Open Day dates for several institutions are also listed. On the websites, you will be able to register to receive information about the Open Day/s, go into draws to win prizes, watch videos from the 2018 days and download the Open Day planner for 2019.

Some institutions haven't updated their Open Day websites yet, so stay tuned.

Suggested questions

By now you should have identified institutions you would like to visit, found out their open day dates and downloaded their open day programs.

Once you have the programs, make a list of the information sessions you would like to attend.

If you have time, try and attend information sessions on topics like pathways, scholarships, accommodation and overseas exchange programs.

If you are unsure what to ask on the day, Victoria University has developed some questions you can ask:

Are there any prerequisite subjects I need to study for this course?

What study scores/ATAR do I need to achieve to get into this course?

Do I need to attend an audition, have an interview or present a folio as part of the selection process?

Are there any other ways into this course other than through a VTAC application?

If I can't get into this course, is there a similar course at this institution I can apply for?

Can I study majors and/or minors in this course?

How many hours per week are spent in class and can I study part time?

Can I defer the course?

What kind of jobs do graduates of this course generally get?

Are there any scholarships available?

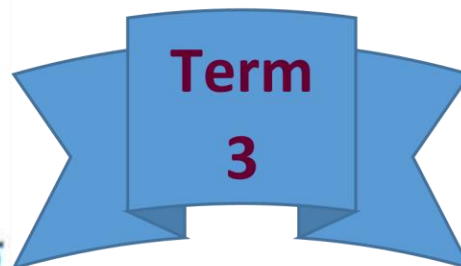

Want to sign your 11 year old up to a CISV Village read these quick FAQs:

What is a Village?

The Village is designed to be a innovative, fun, non-formal 'learning by doing' program for 11-year-old children. By living in a Village, it is hoped that the participants learn with children from around the world about each other's' lives and cultures and how to communicate, cooperate and live together.

What do you do on a Village?

The Village program is divided into four stages. The first allows time for participants to get to know each other and share cultures. Once a strong foundation has been laid, participants develop connections through cooperative activities and continue to share cultural experiences through national days and activities.

What training and preparation is done before travelling to a Village?

Once the delegation has been selected, you will be required to attend some weekend meetings, a delegation activity day and a mini camp. A mini camp is a local weekend camp where participants are given an opportunity to experience what is it like to be in the CISV environment and participate in Village style activities. Before going on a CISV Village, all participants must attend and participate in at least one weekend mini-camp.

What paperwork needs to be completed?

Before a participant travels to a CISV program, there are a number of forms that need to be completed to ensure legal requirements are covered. For each delegate to be covered by CISV Travel Insurance the following forms need to be completed and given to CISV Victoria:

- Health Form - to be filled out by a medical practitioner.
- Child Travelling With Leader Form - signed by parents for appointment of temporary guardian for travel and medical care, release and consents. CISV Victoria will organise all other paperwork to ensure that the invitation has been accepted and the delegation are ready to travel.
