Doctors in Schools Program - Daytime Questions and Parent Information Evening Tuesday 19th September

At the Parent Teacher interviews next Monday we will be providing information to student and families on the Doctors in Schools Program. **There will also be an information evening held at the College on Tuesday 19th September from 6:30pm to 7:30pm in Amadeus to discuss the implementation of the program at Manor Lakes.**

The \$43.8 million Doctors in Secondary Schools initiative is delivering on the election commitment to fund general practitioners (GPs) to attend up to 100 Victorian government secondary schools up to one day a week to provide medical advice and health care to those students most in need.

The objectives of the program are to:

- make primary health care more accessible to students,
- provide assistance to young people to identify and address any health problems early,
- aim to reduce the pressure on working parents and community-based GPs.

The program will make a valuable contribution to achieving the Education State targets of 'happy, healthy and resilient kids' by improving ease of access to health services for young people.

Select Victorian Government secondary schools will work together with local general practices to enable primary health care services to be delivered on school premises. It is anticipated that the program will enable a GP to attend the school for up to one day a week to assist students to identify and address any health problems early.

Secondary Curriculum Day Overview

Secondary Curriculum Day Overview: On Friday 1st September, Secondary staff had their second Curriculum Day of the term, again focusing on how we can improve literacy teaching in our classes.

We ran two workshops; one from Ticking Mind, which focused on strategies for improving reading comprehension, and one from AVID, which taught staff about on-demand writing. In the Ticking Mind workshop, staff learnt about how they can incorporate activities before, during and after reading which will assist students to understand the texts they are engaging within their classes.

In the AVID workshop, teachers collaborated to build their understanding of how students can be taught to plan their writing to ensure they are following the Manor Lakes writing and production process of planning, drafting, revising and editing, and publishing.

These skills of reading comprehension and written expression can be reinforced at home by parents and guardians encouraging their children to read every night, then writing a reflection about what they have read. This can then be used to start conversations about your children's reading, writing and thinking.

Do not forget, you can also use the Manor Lakes writing and production process to support your students with their learning at home!

The Manor Lakes Writing and Production Process

PLANNING DRAFTING REVISING and EDITING PUBLISHING

Planning

- Read through all of the instructions
- Unpack the questions/task and make sure you understand what to do
- Identify the command words and key vocabulary
- Ask your teacher clarifying questions
- Decide on a topic/product/task/project
- Talk with other people about the task
- Gather and organise your ideas and materials. You could use visual organisers like mindmaps, brainstorm, flowcharts etc.
- Identify your audience
- Research information about the task/topic
- Make a list of vocabulary you will use
- List the resources or formulas you will need to use
- Think about the task from beginning to end and make a plan of attack: outline different sections, consider what will go where, what steps you need to take, and in what order you will do things



Drafting

- Create the first version of your final product
- Use your plan of attack to write answers, draw images, create a prototype
- If writing, put your thoughts into full sentences and paragraphs
- Keep your audience in mind: how does the audience affect your work?
- You will make lots of drafts



Revising and Editing

- Look over your draft to see how you can improve it and clarify it
- Make sure that what you have done/written makes sense
- Go back to the original task/topic/question and check that you have done what you were asked to
- Check for correct use of subject information (spelling, key information, formulas, techniques etc)
- Add or remove details and description to improve clarity, fluency and sophistication
- See where you can use more precise or sophisticated vocabulary or techniques
- Ask other people to read your work and give you suggestions about what you have done well and what you could improve
- Use class resources that can help improve your work: textbooks, class notes, thesaurus, calculator etc
- Re-read/proofread/adapt as needed



Publishing

- This is where you make your final piece 'public' by presenting it to an audience
- This could involve giving a presentation, producing a product, delivering a speech, submitting a final copy, or handing up an exam



VCAL IKEA Excursion

On Tuesday 8th August, all VCAL students went on an excursion to Melbourne, specifically IKEA Richmond. Students were required to show personal and group organisation skills, by navigating to IKEA in small groups using public transport. Once at IKEA, students had a given budget and a scenario where they only had \$1000 per person to spend on needed items to have when you move out. Students needed to use numeracy skills to budget and price these items, to later factor them into the other expenses expected in their first month of being out of home.

Students found the experience very helpful, as most had no idea how much money they would need to be independent in the future, which has inspired many to aim high with future career paths. Well done to all who participated. Two students also met Jonathan 'Brownie' Brown (AFL legend).

Year 11 Barwon Excursion

On the Wednesday 2nd August, the Year 11 VCE Legal Studies and Sociology classes went on an excursion to Barwon Prison. Each class had been studying the concepts of criminal sanctions and crimes, and the relativity of deviancy within a modern society. The excursion allowed us as students to see the justice system at work and meet those affected by crime in order to obtain an authentic and real life learning experience. After being introduced to the prisoners by two officers, we were separated into groups and the stories began.

The prisoners talked about their life leading up to their imprisonment and discussed elements such as the people they had hurt, the things they had lost and most importantly, the changes prison had made on their life. All of the prisoners said that being incarcerated was the best thing that had happened to them as it had allowed them to wake up to reality and attempt to better themselves. Besides being beneficial to us as students, we also came to realise how it benefitted the prisoners. For them, this was a rehabilitation program that was allowing them to talk about their crimes and discuss why their life had turned out the way it had without making attributions. Each student took away something different from the excursion, however the experience was a once in a lifetime opportunity that all of us valued and gained something from.


Year 11 Physics
