Wellbeing News

Sun Smart: Just a reminder that broad brimmed Manor Lakes hats are a compulsory part of the school uniform for all students in Primary years during Term 4. With the holidays upon us it is a good time to find where it is hiding and get it ready for October. Primary students who do not have a hat will be asked to play in the shaded areas of the college, which will, of course, limit their play area, but help protect them from the damaging sun's rays.

We strongly advise that students in Secondary years also wear a hat to protect them from the sun.

You may also like to apply sunscreen to your child before they head off for the day. Alternatively, students may prefer to bring their own sunscreen to school where they can apply it themselves before break times.

Headlice: With Spring here you may notice an influx of head lice. Please make the most of the school holiday period to treat your child's head for lice. As lice are becoming resistant to many of the treatments on the market today you might find that the most efficient way to combat this problem is the fine toothed comb and hair conditioner method.

Spread cheap conditioner through dry hair, and then run the comb through taking the conditioner off with the comb. If there are any lice or eggs (nits) they tend to come out with the conditioner, which stuns the live lice enough for you to catch them in the slippery conditioner. When you wipe the comb onto a tissue you will be able to see any eggs or lice caught in the process. If you do this again a few days later, you will be able to catch any lice that have hatched from eggs that were missed in the first treatment. Regular diligence with this method is usually enough to keep them at bay.

Remember, that lice have been around for centuries and they do not discriminate between heads – all people can catch lice. There is no denying that they are a pain and your kids will dislike the time spent treating them but the nasty itching and scratching is so much more irritating. If we all work together on this problem, hopefully this spring will see a smaller 'birth rate'.

Whether it be developing virtual prototypes, providing virtual training scenarios for health care providers or developing new games for the entertainment industry, Virtual and Augmented Reality are likely to continue transforming the way we live over the next decade.

Commencing in 2017, Deakin University, in partnership with California-based Virtual Reality Company EON Reality, will be offering students the opportunity to study a major sequence in Virtual and Augmented Reality as part of the Bachelor of Information Technology. Students will also have the opportunity to undertake an elective industry placement with EON Reality and work directly with VR and AR professionals on industry projects.


