School Uniform

The School Uniform Working Party met again last night and will table a recommendation of uniform changes to School Council. If these changes are approved, they will be adopted immediately. Below is a summary of the recommendations to be made and parents have the opportunity to make a comment to School Council when deciding on the recommendation.

If you wish to make comment, please feel free to email, phone or write to me. All comments will be passed on to School Council.

I very much wish to thank the parents who attended meetings and offered their ideas and opinions throughout the discussion.

The discussion about school uniform was very much around maintaining current colours, ensuring that current uniform will remain uniform (though current items may no longer be sold) reducing price and ensuring our students looked smart and are recognizable as Manor Lakes College students.

Secondary and Year 6 students were surveyed to give their opinion on options and voted their preferences for uniform items. Where students voted the winning vote was honoured.

The following will be the basis of the recommendation to School Council.

- Secondary uniform will no longer be summer and winter. Students will be able to wear their uniform preference based on weather.
- Secondary students will have the option of wearing either an active/sports uniform or a formal uniform. While some items are in both active and formal, students will not be allowed to mix and match.

Active:

- Manor Lakes sports shirt – will need to be purchased from Rushfords or identified supplier.
- Black tracksuit pants or black shorts – can be purchased from any supplier, e.g. Rushfords, Best and Less, Target etc.
- Runners
- Black or White socks
- Manor Lakes rugby top – will need to be purchased from Rushfords
- Manor Lakes jacket – will need to be purchased from Rushfords

Formal:

- Black leather shoes
- Black or white socks
- Black pants or black shorts – can be purchased from any supplier, e.g. Rushfords, Best and Less, Target
- White, collared shirt – can be purchased from any supplier, e.g. Rushfords, Best and Less, Target, etc., (Shirt should have a school logo; iron on logos will be available for \$2)
- Summer dress or Winter skirt – current uniform item
- Manor Lakes rugby top – current uniform item
- Manor Lakes jacket – will need to be purchased from Rushfords (picture below)



A number of optional items have been identified as current uniform pieces and will still be available to purchase:

- Manor Lakes jumper
- Manor Lakes blazer (secondary)
- Manor Lakes tie (secondary)
- Plain black beanie, black scarf, black gloves – these can have a Manor Lakes logo, but are not to have other branding or advertising
- Manor Lakes school bag

Primary students:

Black leather shoes or runners (any colour allowed, but neutral tones preferred) black or white socks, grey tracksuit pants, grey shorts, grey pants, summer skirt, winter dress or winter tunic, blue t-shirt or polo, (iron on logo available or purchased from Rushfords with logo), current school jumper/top and school hat for terms 1 and 4.

It is exciting to see many changes happening around the college after the Easter Break. Our leadership restructure has now taken place at secondary and we would like to welcome two new staff members to our Team – Jennifer Bashford as our new Literacy Coach and Patricia Akceken as our new English as an Additional Language teacher.

We have been very happy with the response from parents regarding their support of the school for us to continue to build safe and positive learning environments. To assist with this process, we have now updated our detention procedures (outlined below). Please remember that parents are able to inform college processes through school council and it would be great to have more feedback submitted in this forum.

Please remind your child that they are not allowed to leave the school without signing out through one of the main offices. Administration may contact you to ensure that this has been agreed upon.

It is a busy term ahead as students will be participating in NAPLAN, Year 10s will be looking more closely at career pathways and our Year 12s have the GAT and Year 12 Camp coming up. Please contact your child's Advocate or Team Leader if you have any queries.

Updated Detention Process:

Staff will set recess and lunchtime detentions for minor classroom disruptions. If a student does not attend these detentions, staff will contact parents to set an afterschool detention from 3:10pm-3:40pm in Illawarra 1 with our Student Behaviour Management Leading Teaching – Krystal Jessop. The leadership team can also set afterschool detentions.

If a student fails to attend an afterschool detention, a Team Leader will contact parents to reschedule the detention. If this rescheduled detention is not sat, the Student Behaviour Management Leading Teaching or an Assistant Principal will make parent contact.

Parents will also receive an email reminding them of the detention/rescheduled detention times and dates. Detentions will also show up on a student's schedule on Compass.

If a student does not attend their rescheduled detention, the Student Behaviour Management Leading Teaching or an Assistant Principal will set an internal suspension and provide the student with classwork.

NAPLAN:

Students in Year 7 and 9 will be completing NAPLAN Tests in Week 4 as outlined below. Any students who are absent for the tests will have the opportunity to complete make up tests throughout week 4. All students were given a NAPLAN information letter to be sent home in week 2 outlining key information. Should you have any further questions, please contact Paul Bombaci via the college office.

National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) 2017

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is an annual assessment for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It has been a part of the school calendar since 2008. NAPLAN tests the sorts of skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life, such as reading, writing, spelling and numeracy. The assessments are undertaken nationwide, every year, in the second full week in May. This year they begin on **Tuesday 9th May 2017** and finish on **Thursday 11th May 2017**.

- **Language Conventions** incorporates Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation.
- **Numeracy** incorporates Number, Geometry, Algebra, Measurement, Chance and Data, function and patterns.
- **Reading** incorporates comprehension.
- **Writing** incorporates writing for a purpose and audience.

It is extremely important that your child attends school on these days. Please try to ensure your child has had enough sleep, has eaten breakfast and has a nourishing lunch and snacks each day.

After completion of these tests, a NAPLAN report will be issued later in the year. This report is only one aspect of the Manor Lakes College assessment and reporting process and does not replace the more extensive and informed judgments made by your child's teacher.

The test results are used for many purposes some of which include:

- For parents to track their child's progress;
- For teachers to use results to help them identify students that require greater challenge or support;
- For schools to identify strengths and weaknesses in Literacy and Numeracy and to set future goals in these areas;
- For the Department of Education and Training to review programs and the support they offer to individual schools;
- To underpin the Victorian Curriculum.

Early Achievers Program at Australian Catholic University (ACU): This is an early entry program that takes into account factors other than just your ATAR for admission into courses. Factors include evidence of community service, leadership, and school participation etc. If you are accepted into the program, you will be guaranteed entry into the degree of your choice with a minimum ATAR, providing you meet prerequisites. The following are the minimum ATARs for the 2018 intake

- 70: Law and all dual Law degrees
- 70: Physiotherapy (subject to change)
- 6/5: Occupational Therapy, Speech Pathology, and Paramedicine.
- 58/5: all other degrees.

It's time we talked

Parent information session on pornography, young people and sexuality today.

Sexually explicit imagery is now easily accessed, created and shared. For young people, it is almost impossible to avoid. Pornography has also become a default sex educator for many young people, with serious implications for their capacity to negotiate free and full consent, mutual respect, sexual health and gender equality.

What will be explored?

What do parents need to understand about pornography and its influences on young people's sexual understanding and expectations?

How can parents support their children's health, social and sexual development in an age of pornography?

Parents, Carers and Grandparents of secondary school aged children.



About the facilitator

Maree Crabbe has worked with young people and the issues affecting them for over 20 years. Maree coordinates the community education project *Reality & Risk: Pornography, young people and sexuality*.
