Each of the student sessions will offer information, activities and provide an opportunity for students to ask questions.

Session	Date	Focus
1	November 17	Reproductive system, Conception, Pregnancy and Birth
2	November 28	Introduction to puberty; Physical, emotional and social changes
3	December 7	Puberty, menstruation and sperm production, changes and transitions in relationships, support networks during puberty.

Students will participate in each of these sessions with their class group. Each session is 90 minutes.

As this content is aligned with the Victorian Curriculum, it is expected that all students participate. An alternative program will not be available for students who do not participate.





South Sudanese Positive Parenting Program

Why this program?

South Sudanese in Australia face significant parenting challenges within their families as a result of changes in traditional parenting practices. There is a need to support South Sudanese families in developing a shared understanding of approaches to parenting which respects community tradition while integrating the societal and legal context pertaining to children and young people living in Victoria.

What does the program aim to achieve?

The program aims to:

- Increase knowledge and understanding within South Sudanese families regarding positive parenting approaches.
- Increase awareness among South Sudanese parents regarding relevant Victorian child and family systems, parenting responsibilities and children's rights.
- Provide opportunities for South Sudanese parents to connect and share parenting challenges and learnings.
- Support South Sudanese youth and provide pathways to increased community engagement.

What will the day involve?

The program is being facilitated by Dr. Santino Atem Deng (Anglicare Victoria) who will be giving a presentation on family and parenting challenges and how to address them.

Relevant service providers, including Government Departments and local NGOs, will be setting up display tables in the half and also present to the participants about their services.
