The college has been advised of 4 cases of Chickenpox in the **Year 7** cohort. If your child is displaying any of the symptoms mentioned below, please keep them home from school and consult your local doctor.

Chickenpox

What are the symptoms of Chickenpox? The main symptoms are:

- Low grade fever
- Malaise
- Rash: this will develop to blisters which will then progress to crusted lesions over about 5 days

Can my child still go to school? No. As Chickenpox is highly contagious children need to stay away from school until fully recovered or for at least five days after the first eruption appears.

As you are aware, the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) has rolled out in our area. This is crucial in allowing your child to access therapies, respite, case workers and post-school options. The process can also be daunting and complicated at times. We understand that parents require support through the complexities of this process and have arranged for staff from our local NDIS provider, Brotherhood of St Laurence, to attend Manor Lakes College throughout Term Four to support families in the application process.

There will be a parent information session run by Brotherhood of St Laurence staff at 3:30pm on Thursday 17th October in the Echo building. This will cover the application process and a general overview for navigating the NDIS. A staff member for Association for Children with a Disability (ACD) will also be in attendance; this is an advocacy agency who can assist in giving advice for getting your child the best plan under the NDIS.

On Tuesday 22nd October (10am-1pm) and Wednesday 23nd October (2-4pm) multiple Brotherhood of St Laurence staff will be available to facilitate individual parent consultations to commence the application process for NDIS. If you have already commenced your application, I encourage you to attend the earlier parent information session to ensure familiarity with the entire process.
