Dear Parents and Carers,

It was lovely seeing so many parents and carers attend the Student Support Group meetings held in Supported Learning this week. Your child's Individual Education Plan drafts are reflective of a combined and shared understanding of the long term goals that we will work towards during the semester. Final plans will be made available to you prior to the end of the term and reviewed at the end of term 2.

Last week we also held two parent information sessions for students in Primary Supported Learning and Secondary Supported Learning outlining the academic and futures program for the year. During this session we discussed our new reporting process. Each semester your child will receive a report on Compass that outlines an overview of content covered along with a narrative of performance. The curriculum areas will include; English, Maths, Integrated Studies, Science, Community Access/Travel Education, Personal/Social Learning, Health and Physical Education and Performing and Visual Arts. These curriculum areas are consistent with the Department of Education reporting guidelines. Your child's report will be available at the end of term 2.

We would like to extend an invitation to all parents and carers to attend our Supported Learning assembly this Friday afternoon at 2.15 – 3.00 in Amadeus Hall.
